

City of Wetaskiwin Seeks New Photo Radar Provider

(Wetaskiwin, Alberta) – The City of Wetaskiwin is issuing a Request for Proposal (RFP) to find a new photo radar service provider in 2019.

The existing contract is not being renewed as the City of Wetaskiwin wishes to explore the many different types of automated traffic enforcement service providers to ensure that the chosen model fits with the City's current organizational structure. Key items highlighted in the RFP include mobile speed enforcement, intersection cameras, and red light/speed on green cameras positioned at specifically-chosen locations throughout the City of Wetaskiwin. These locations were selected through enforcement data collected from the RCMP and Community Peace Officers, and have been determined to be one or more of the following:

- High-risk enforcement locations where the safety of citizens or enforcement officers would be at risk through conventional enforcement methods.
- High-frequency locations where data indicates motorists are ignoring or breaking traffic law(s) on an ongoing basis.
- High-collision locations where data indicates a greater frequency of property damage, injury or fatal collisions.
- High-pedestrian volume locations where data indicates a high volume of pedestrian traffic.

Automated traffic enforcement is meant to enhance current enforcement within the City of Wetaskiwin and is not meant to replace conventional enforcement and/or officer contact.

Revenue collected from fines within the City of Wetaskiwin is specifically allocated for traffic safety initiatives such as safer pedestrian crossings, intersection safety incentives, improved signage throughout the City, and other safety initiatives as identified by Administration or the residents of Wetaskiwin.
