

Wetaskiwin City Council Concludes 2019 Budget Deliberations

March 15, 2019

(Wetaskiwin, Alberta) –Wetaskiwin City Council has completed two full days of deliberating the 2019 proposed City budget. The deliberations were held at Wetaskiwin City Hall on March 14 and 15, beginning at 8 am each day.

While many core municipal services will be funded through 2019, specific attention was given to the following priority areas:

- Public safety and security
- Organizational accountability
- Community connection and engagement
- Infrastructure investment

“This budget actively addresses many of the concerns brought forward by local residents and business owners, especially regarding public safety and organizational transparency” said Mayor Tyler Gandam. “Through continued community engagement, Council can better understand the needs of the City and adequately plan for a prosperous future.”

A public budget open house is planned for Thursday, March 21 from 6 pm until 8 pm at Wetaskiwin City Hall (4705 – 50 Avenue). Members of Council and City staff will be on hand to answer budget-related questions. Printed copies of the proposed 2019 budget document will be available at the open house, though residents can access it online at any time by visiting www.wetaskiwin.ca/budget2019.

City Council is expected to vote on the 2019 budget at their regular March 25, 2019 Council meeting.
