

**BY-LAW NO. 2036-23
OF THE
CITY OF WETASKIWIN
IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA**

A BY-LAW OF THE CITY OF WETASKIWIN IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA,
TO AMEND BYLAW NO. 1893-17 FOR THE REGULATION OF STREETS,
SIDEWALKS AND THOROUGHFARES WITHIN THE CITY OF WETASKIWIN.

WHEREAS the Traffic Safety Act authorizes a municipality to regulate and control vehicle, animal and pedestrian traffic as well as parking on streets and property within the municipality

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Government Act, allows a municipality to pass Bylaws as well as delegate authority with respect to streets under its direction, control and management;

NOW THEREFORE, the Municipal Council of the City of Wetaskiwin in the Province of Alberta hereby enacts a Bylaw to regulate Vehicle, Animal and Pedestrian Traffic in the City of Wetaskiwin as follows:

The Municipal Council of the City of Wetaskiwin has deemed it necessary to make the following amendments:

1. This Bylaw may be cited as the “Traffic Amendment Bylaw.”
2. That under Section 42 SPECIAL EVENTS REQUIRING ROADWAY CLOSURES, PARADES AND PROCESSIONS:
 - a. Section 42(1)(ii) ‘City Council’ be replaced with ‘the City Manager or their designated representative.’
 - b. Section 42(1)(iii) remove the words “City Council” and “City Engineer” and replace with “the City Manager or their designated representative.”
 - c. Section 42(2) Permit Application be amended to read:
 - i. "Any Person intending to hold a special event requiring a roadway closure, parade or procession within the City shall, at least ten (10) days prior to the date of the intended Parade or Procession, submit a formal application in writing to City Manager or their designated representative."

3. Section 49(2) VENDING GOODS ON HIGHWAYS

- a. Section 49(2) 'City Council' be replaced with 'the City Manager or their designated representative.'
