# Changes in 2025

- Hired two new Community Peace Officers.
- The first Peace Officer finished training in quarter two (Q2) of 2025, and the second Peace Officer is scheduled to finish training in Q4 of 2025.
- Provincial legislation resulted in the shutdown of the Automated Traffic Enforcement (ATE) program on April 01, 2025.
- New Community Standards Bylaw in August 2024, and an amendment in June 2025.
- New Dispatching contract Q1 2025.
- New Body-Worn Cameras purchased in Q2, with implementation in Q3.




# Occurrence Reports (Concerns)

- 1756 Occurrence Reports
- 290 (16.5%) Officer Observed

- 2025

- 2246 (27.9% increase) Occurrence Reports
- 579 (25.8%) Officer Observed

- Business License - 24




# Daily Events (Proactive Patrols)

- 2863 Daily Events (72.4% Increase)



# Results of Increased Personnel

Enforcement Services has a service level goal to have personnel available 351 out of 365 days. Personnel do not currently work on statutory holidays. In 2024, **94.03%** of days were staffed. In 2025, **98.9%** of days were staffed.

Public Events are significant to Enforcement Services and include service levels of 100 positive tickets, 6 community engagement parties, participation in the Canada Day Parade, participation in the Santa Clause Parade, and 2 community engagement events.

In 2025, we accomplished the following:

- **293** positive tickets issued, donated from 5 community partners
- **7** community engagement parties
- **67** community engagement events

- 774 Daily Events (proactive patrols to businesses and officer-initiated interactions)






# Violation Tickets & Warnings

- Tickets 2024: 1,176 (Including Photo Radar)
- Tickets 2025: 566 (51.9% decrease)
  - Photo Radar changed to red light violations only in 2025 and was decommissioned in Q1 of 2025.



- Warnings 2024: 184
- Warnings 2025: 232 (26% increase)



# Animal Control Stats 2025

## Canines

- Total: 89
- RTO (Return to Owner): 34
- RTO Percentage: 38%



## Felines

- Total: 233
- RTO (Return to Owner) : 18
- RTO Percentage: 8%



# Looking Ahead for 2026

- New Community Peace Officer Position on a 2-year temporary term. Position is a split between dedicated traffic enforcement and Planning & Development compliance.
- Working with Fleet Services and the new fleet policy to review and replace fleet vehicles as required.
- Police Committee training and development in 2026.
- Review of Enforcement Services Level to align with Council Strategic direction.
